What is Christmas/Hanukkah?

Aside from having a Christmas feast, many Christian Americans will go to Church to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas. Many churches have special Christmas Carol services and events where the story of Christmas is told. Dr. Mitchell Masterson Postdoctoral Scholar



We asked some questions to Dr. Mitchell Masterson, who will be speaking with his wife at the International Scholars Meet & Greet on November 20th! Follow his story below.

Please tell us a little bit about your background (before coming to UCR).

I am from England, and my family is from a small village called Gamlingay, close(ish) to Cambridge to pick a city that people will actually know. I studied Biochemistry in undergraduate and completed my PhD at the University of Nottingham in circadian genetics in 2021, working around COVID restrictions, although it was honestly a great time to write a thesis. Very soon after my thesis submission, me and my wife Emily made our way out to Riverside on a flight carrying only people who'd managed to get a Covid-19 dispensation to travel, so it was almost empty!

Please briefly describe your role at UCR.

I am a postdoc in Entomology now, but I am working in mammalian systems investigating genes related to those of interest to my lab in drosophila. I work primarily with human cell lines in cultures.

How did you get into molecular biology?

Biology has always been of interest to me, my undergraduate course of biochemistry was chosen to allow me to keep some use of my chemistry knowledge, but in the end I shifted a bit more biology focus. My undergraduate project was neuronal culture with a focus on miRNA gene expression control which really got me interested in genetics research.

What have been some challenges that you have faced since coming to the US?

Adjusting to American socializing took a little while. I arrived at the tail end of COVID, so things were still half online half in person which was a bit rough as I tried to settle into a new place and make new friends. I've had some health issues (being on crutches for a while and then having surgery) but fortunately I had Emily to help me out a lot, as well as generous people I've met through the international scholars group. And it turns out the postdoc health insurance is pretty good! I actually had no money issues in the process at all.

What are some of your favorite memories at UCR?

We've gone to so many incredible places, sequoia national park is definitely worth checking out along with Yellowstone, the Grand Canyon, ... I'm really fond of the people I've met here so any of the group events for sure, a small group of us went out to Catalina, that'd probably easily be my highlight if I hadn't been on crutches at the time!

Information for International Scholars

As the holiday season approaches, it is important to keep in mind that the university will be closed on certain days in November and December.

November: The UCR campus will be closed 11/11/2024, 11/28-29/2024.

December: The UCR campus will be closed 12/23/2024 – 01/01/2025.

Please consider campus holidays and closures when planning to visit or make requests of the ISS office.

Additionally, if you have plans to travel during the holiday season, please remember what is required to reenter the United States and ensure that you have them available before you leave. Should you find yourself without them during the holiday season, it will be difficult for the ISS office to assist you.

You must present the following at the U.S. port-of-entry (airport or land border):

- 1) Current passport valid for at least 6 months after the reentry date
- 2) Valid U.S. visa
- 3) Valid DS-2019 with return authorization signature (travel endorsement).
