IMMIGRATION REMINDERS

Full Time Course Load

If you have not yet registered for the Fall quarter, please remember that you need to be enrolled in full time units (12 units) per your F-1/J-1 status. Keep in mind that only one online course is allowed. All other coursework must be in-person.

F-2 students cannot be enrolled in a full course load per regulations and therefore need to be enrolled in under 12 units.

Students who are on a tourist visa cannot legally attend school in the United States.

Program Extension

Don't forget to check your I-20/DS-2019 end date. If you need more time to complete your degree, you need to [apply for a program extension before your current I-20 or DS-2019 form expires.](#)

Maintaining F and J status

IMPORTANT TRAVEL UPDATES

All F-1 and J-1 students should carefully evaluate travel risks before deciding to travel. Changes to U.S government policies and regulations are unpredictable and could impact return travel to the United States.

If you do decide to travel, please ensure that you have all your travel documents in order; including a recent travel signature on your DS-2019/I-20 Form.

 - Make any updates to your Local Address


